#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING - On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing



discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. The Church calls us to acknowledge Christ's kingship with our whole lives: He must reign in our minds, in our wills, in our hearts, and cleave to him alone. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus Christ is the sovereign ruler of the universe, recognizing His authority over all creation and inviting believers to acknowledge his reign in their lives.
